<b>Job title</b>	Senior Lecturer in Law

### Main purpose of the job

The post holder will be expected to teach a range of modules at undergraduate and postgraduate level; and, support the development of courses in the School of Law and Criminology; and, contribute to the research and publication profile of the department.

### Key areas of responsibility

- 1 Responsibility for teaching modules on the LLB Foundation and LLB (Hons) degrees, particularly Constitutional Law, Equity and Trusts, European Union Law, Land Law and (at both UG and PG level) Intellectual Property Law, and generally to support teaching across the school.
- 2 Undertake administrative duties associated with the management of the university and its teaching programmes, as necessary.
- 3 Administrative and programme responsibility.
- 4 Contribute to new programme developments at undergraduate and postgraduate level.
- 5 Undertake the necessary examination and assessment preparation/monitoring that may be required by the teaching programme.
- 6 Keep abreast of relevant technical development and to undertake self-development by participation in the university staff appraisal scheme and in service training programme, as appropriate.
- 7 Contribute to research and consultancy work either on an individual basis or as part of collaborative projects.
- 8 Provide counselling and pastoral support for students.

In addition to the above areas of responsibility the position may be required to undertake any other reasonable duties relating to the broad scope of the position.
