Main purpose of the job

Work with the Forensic Science academic team under the leadership of the Head of Subject and Head of School to support the development of marketing, recruitment, admissions, retention and progression plans and processes so as to increase levels of achievement and student satisfaction in the areas of teaching and learning
- 4. Contribute to the scholarship, specialist expertise and research in the School of Human and Social Science
- 5. Contribute and support the teaching and assessment in interdisciplinary and/or specialist modules, including assessment and examination boards for cross institutional programmes, and liaising with external examiners (where appropriate)
- 6. Pro-actively engage with the wider external academic, practitioner and third sector communities through involvement with professional bodies and other related organisations and the development of a personal network of contacts.
- 7. Undertake research and scholarship in line with the School's research targets and strategy.
- 8. Undertake CPD, including HEA Fellowship
- 9. To undertake other appropriate tasks commensurate with the grade as required by the Head of Subject / School.
