- Develop high quality teaching and learning materials to support the delivery of the modules and course.
- Deliver innovative teaching, learning and assessment strategies that enhance the student learning experience.
- Support students throughout their course, acting as personal tutor, monitoring and reporting on their progression to the Course Leader and supporting their knowledge acquisition and key academic skills development.
- Present module results at progression boards and liaise with the external examiner for the course.

- Work in partnership with the course team, clinical staff, managers and service users to deliver high quality modules/courses relevant to the needs of health service users and their carers/families/significant others.
- Support and assist in the contribution of applied research, professional development and other scholarly activity, in support of the College's academic development programme.
- Take responsibility for ensuring one's own academic and professional development is maintained.
- Support recruitment and selection activity commensurate with the grade of Lecturer.
- Carry out all necessary administrative responsibilities, participate and engage fully in quality assurance processes within the College and wider University.
