Main purpose of the job

We are recruiting an experienced Research Assistant familiar with undertaking systematic reviews and who has experience of working or caring for people living with dementia. The successful candidate will support the delivery of the *METHODEM: Methodological consensus for complex interventions in dementia* research project at the Geller Institute of Ageing and Memory, University of West London. The project is being conducted in collaboration with INTERDEM a pan-European network of researchers for evaluating psychosocial interventions in dementia. METHODEM is a two-year INTERDEM <u>Methodology Taskforce</u>led project funded by the Alzheimer's Association. It includes two complementary studies that aim to i) provide a comprehensive overview of designs and methodologies for research on complex psychosocial interventions in dementia care (Study 1) and ii) reach a consensus on which designs/methodologies match the core elements and phases of the UK Medical Research Council (MRC) framework (Study 2).

The successful post-holder will initially contribute to a systematic review to underpin the revision of designs and methodologies used for developing, evaluating, and implementing complex psychosocial interventions in dementia care (Study 1). The post-holder will also contribute to the preparation and implementation of a multi-stage Delphi study aimed at transforming expert opinions into a group consensus through survey rounds and group discussions with stakeholders (Study 2). In addition, the post-holder will assist in writing research materials, ethical applications and reports as well as carry out administrative duties such as scheduling meetings, preparation and mail-out of meeting documents.

Applications for this position are invited from candidates who will ideally have experience of working within mixed-methods research projects in mental health or dementia as well as excellent communication and organisational skills. Experience of dementia research would be advantageous.



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Key areas of responsibility

- Provide day-to-day assistance with the preparation of research materials and reports, including the design of study tools and data management.
- Work with the project leads to ensure that the programme is fulfilling its objectives, meeting its targets, and producing meaningful outputs.
- Support the planning and conduct of systematic review to underpin the revision of designs and methodologies for developing, evaluating, and implementing complex psychosocial interventions in dementia care.
- Employ established systems for data collection, storage and analysis. Maintain files of current protocols, participant information sheets and consent forms and related information.
- Attend relevant training as required for the successful delivery and completion of the project (e.g. JBI review, Good clinical practice, Informed consent training).
- Regularly liaise in person, by telephone, video conference and email with other members of the project team.
- Liaise regularly and maintain good relations with partner organisations and relevant stakeholders such as people living with dementia, health and social care services staff, and policy makers.
- Be involved in project awareness raising activities and recruitment of participants.
- Be familiar with the Mental Capacity Act and obtaining appropriate consent or agreement from people with dementia and other stakeholders who participate in the study.
- Collect data: provide information; obtain official reports and service use data; administer questionnaires; conduct research interviews; etc.
- Conduct analysis of qualitative and quantitative data.
- Contribute to the writing of project reports, ethical applications, peer-reviewed and other papers and presentation.
- Contribute to research activities on other related studies.
- Provide administration support including organising research group meetings, collaborator meetings, making action notes and preparing reports to the funder and ethics committee.

In addition to the above areas of responsibility the post-holder maybe required to undertake any other reasonable duties relating to the broad scope of the position, commensurate with the post, and in support of the University.
